

# PERMISSION TO PRINT IMAGES

**THIS IS THE IMPORTANT PART: I, Erika Sidor, give full permission for my client (and their family) to print *any and all* photos from their wedding/event/portrait session for personal use. DVD's have been presented to my client expressly for this purpose, they may do whatever they'd like with them.**

**Printing notes:** My camera shoots at a **2x3 aspect ratio**. This means that if you ask for an 8x10, you are actually cropping 2 inches off of the end. To print the *entire original image*, it would actually need to be an 8x12. This may not matter to you, but please pay attention to this when placing a print order. If you do not ask for it as an 8x12, then you should at least look at the image carefully and tell the lab **HOW** you want it cropped. (One inch from each end, or two inches from a particular end.)

The only size that will be accurate is a 4x6...because it's the 2x3 aspect ratio!

Why do print labs do this? Because long ago, when paper standards and photo printing was begun, a whole industry sprang up *around these standards*...for frames, mats, prints, etc. There's not much you can do except be aware of this when getting prints made.
